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CURRICULUM

William Brennan High School is accredited by the Texas Education Agency. A comprehensive curriculum is available with more than 150 courses offered from which students may select and plan a four-year program. Course ranges from Dual Credit, Advanced Placement, Honors to remedial curriculum. Students may plan their programs to prepare them for college and the world of work. Advanced Placement courses are offered in English, math, science, social studies, and foreign languages. We currently offer 34 Pre-AP courses, 31 AP courses, and 18 Dual credit courses. Brennan offers a variety of industrial technology programs, computer technology programs, family and consumer science programs, and career and technology programs.

WEIGHTED CLASSES

Pre Advanced Placement and Advanced Placement courses are weighed by adding five points to the semester grade for Pre Advanced Placement and eight points for Advanced Placement semester grades. Weighted grades are used in computing grade average and rank in class, but numerical grades in the transcript do not show the added points. The codes "H" and "AP" are used as part of the course title to designate weighted courses. "D" denotes courses taken in the dual credit program.

GRADING SCALE

All grades are recorded numerically. Transfer grades are recorded and are given the numerical equivalent according to the grade scale of the sending school. The following grade scale is used:

- A = 90-100 Excellent**
- B = 80-89 Above Average**
- C = 75-79 Average**
- D = 70-74 Below Average**
- F = 0-69 Failing**
